NCAPA Regional Chapter CME Grant in memory of Mark Sizemore and Mandy Dozier. Provides support for continuing medical education endeavors.

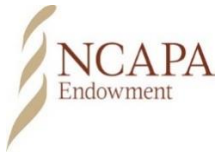
Student Emergency Fund. Provides emergency funds to NC PA students.
